# Mutual Respect



Protected characteristics are aspects of a person's identity that are protected under the **Equality Act 2010**. This law makes it illegal to discriminate against someone based on these characteristics, helping to promote a fairer and more equal society.

What does the verb, to discriminate, mean?

Discrimination is the unfair or prejudicial treatment of people and groups based on *protected characteristics*. It often stems from negative stereotypes. For example, stereotypes about race can lead to racism.

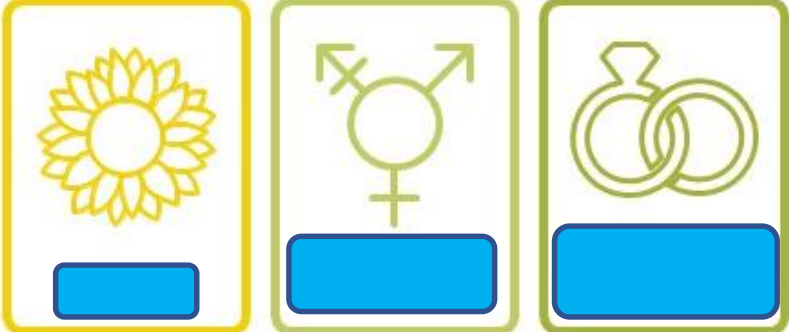
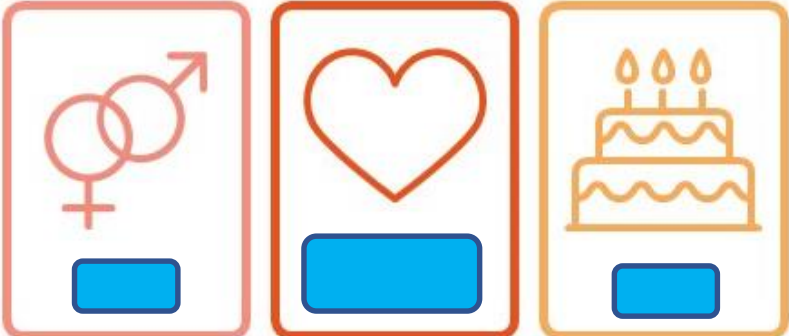

# Mutual Respect

## Race

## Religion or Belief

The Equality Act 2010 protects people against discrimination based on their religion or beliefs.

Antisemitism describes prejudice and discrimination against Judaism and Jewish people. It is typically based on intolerance and fear of Jewish people.

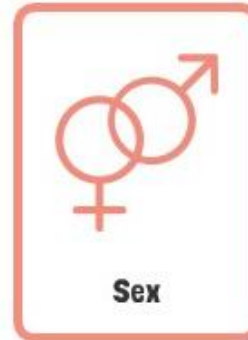
Prejudice and discrimination against Muslim people are referred to as Islamophobia. It is typically based on intolerance and fear of Islam and of Muslim people.
