What we funded 2024/2025

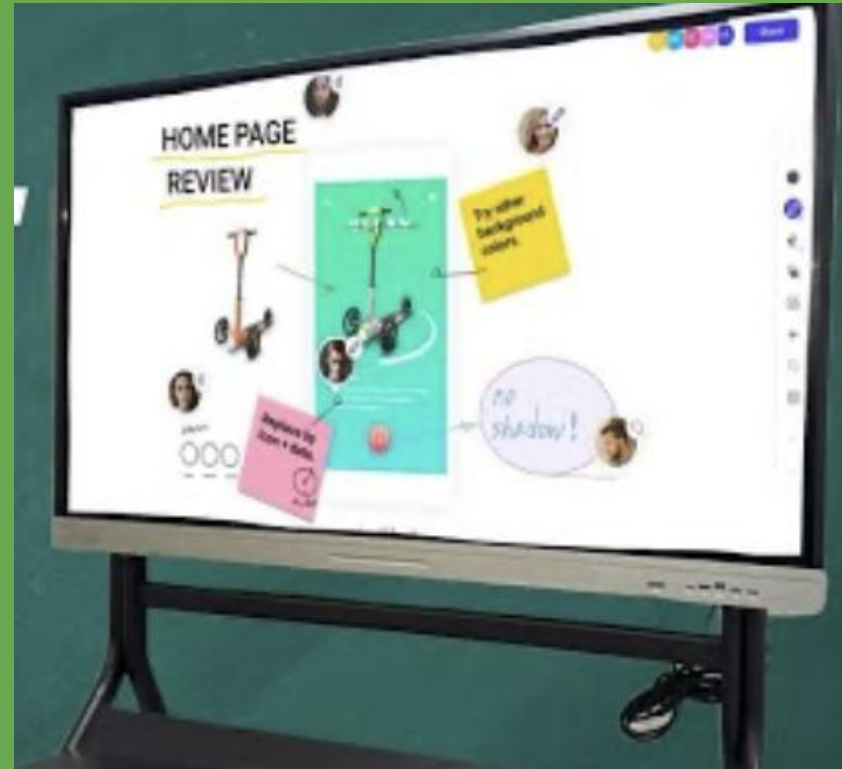
White boards £5,000

Replacement of out of date and aged interactive whiteboards in the classrooms.

Why: Teachers use the interactive whiteboards daily as a core tool for teaching. Upgrading these will enable;

- more complex use cases benefitting learning for pupils
- more interactivity for the environment the children learn in
- speed of delivering content for teachers

The old whiteboards were donated to other schools in the local area to upgrade their own facilities.



LIGHTING RIG

- The existing stage lighting was on it's last legs and in constant need of repair.
- To ensure that the children can be seen on the stage for many years to come we agreed to pay for new LED lighting for school performances and events.
- Total cost £1800



CURRICULUM BIDS

What is it?

A program designed to enable teachers to deliver curriculum enhancing initiatives, otherwise unfunded, utilising their knowledge and expertise to add value to their school and pupils, without the restriction of budget constraints.

Requests:

In autumn 2024, we received 6 bids from staff/heads of department which went through a review process with PTA and Parent Reps.

ALL bids were supported.

In addition in the summer 2025 term we asked for additional bids which were supported.



Rainbow Room

Rainbow Room: This is the space used for SENDCo support and also other activities for children requiring a calm and nurturing environment, but was in need of a makeover to create the optimal space to deliver on its goal.

Huge thanks to Nuria and Liz for leading the project and delivering an incredible new space.

Cost: £14K



Outdoor Welly boot area

Outdoor Welly Boot area: Request to create an area to store wellies for the outdoor learning area/ forest school to reduce any mud being brought into the school.

Cost: £750 (Music Trust x 2 terms)

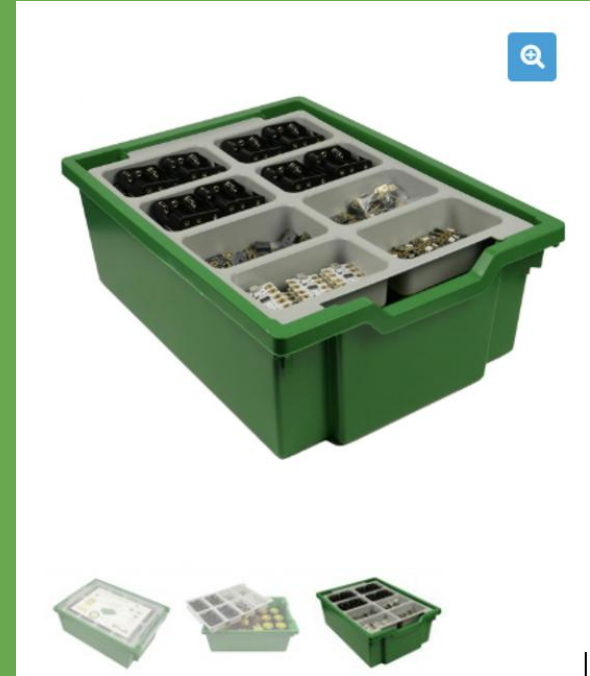


Crumble Kit

Crumble Starter Kit and additional components to support the school's computing curriculum. This includes programmable controllers, motors, LEDs, and sensors to enable hands-on coding and physical computing activities for pupils.

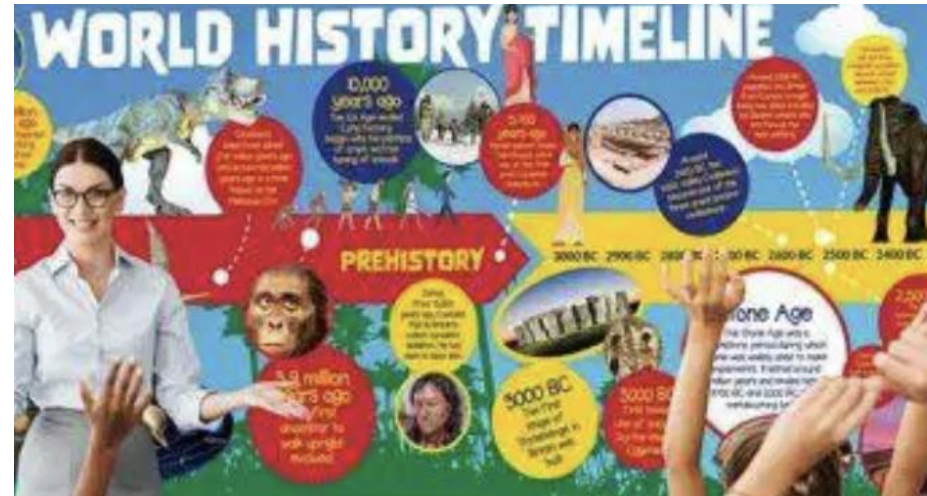
How will this benefit children: The Crumble Kit will enhance **teaching and learning** by making coding more interactive and engaging. Pupils will develop computational thinking, problem-solving, and programming skills through real-world applications. It also supports **STEM education**, encouraging creativity and teamwork, and may help inspire more children—especially girls—into technology-related fields.

COST: £500



History Timeline

- Chronology is an ongoing process in how the students learn history and it plays an important role in both the teaching and learning of history.
- All history units start with a lesson including a timeline and can be hard for children to make the links between different periods without visual aids.
- The outdoor timeline would allow the children to make visual links, promote discussion and make comparisons.
- Total cost £1042

- Last year's projects achieved strong "small wins" (grounds, resources, classroom boards).
- Remaining sustainability projects are large-scale (solar panels, LED lighting) – high cost, less immediate impact for pupils.

Next Step: Smarter Technology Upgrade

- School due a major computer hardware refresh.
- Direct benefit: immediate improvement to teaching and learning.
- Indirect benefit: energy-efficient devices reduce electricity use and future-proof our infrastructure.
- Builds on sustainability focus while making a visible difference to pupils every day.

To Discuss:

- PTA support for funding towards pupil-facing IT upgrades?
- A project that is both greener and felt by every child?

SECONDARY FUNDRAISING

What: Investigate and draw up a proposal for sustainable amendments to the school premises. Including areas such as;

- Solar Panelling
- LED Lighting throughout the school

Why: To drive cost and sustainability efficiencies for the school and to set an example to pupils and our community by leading on sustainability initiatives

Next Step: To review potential areas of focus and assess impact to create actionable proposal by end of Half Term.

SECONDARY FUNDRAISING- Curriculum bids

What:

- Continuing the curriculum bids in 2025/26
- Bids submitted by October Half Term by Teachers (approved by SLT)
- Decisions made via scoring criteria applied by 2 x PTA Reps and 2 x Class Reps
- Feedback to staff on successful bids w/c 4th November.

Why:

- Goal to empower teaching staff to highlight areas of educational enrichment they see value in.
- Empower them via finding to deliver autonomous enhancements for their school and pupils.

FUNDRAISING GOAL 2025/2026

To build on the funding strategy from last year, we are setting a soft fundraising profit goal of **£14K** for this year.

Alongside funds raised through events and donations, we aim to increase the Grant potential funding, to align with the primary fundraising initiative, to optimise incoming revenue.

CONSTITUTION - CHANGES

24. No alteration to this constitution may be made except at the AGM or a Special General Meeting called for this purpose. No amendments or alterations shall be made without the prior written permission to the Charity Commission to Clauses 2, 24 and 25 and no alteration shall be made which could cause the Association to cease to be a charity in law. Alterations to the Constitution shall receive the assent of two thirds of members present and voting at an AGM or Special General Meeting.
